The new 50-franc note

The new 50-franc note has arrived. It is the first of six banknotes to be phased in by the Swiss National Bank.

More than 20 years have passed since the last banknote series was issued. A new series is required in order to maintain our high security standards.

This booklet introduces you to the look and feel of the first new note, showing you how it is designed and explaining its easily verifiable security features. The inspiration behind the new banknote series is 'The many facets of Switzerland'.





Check if your note is genuine

You can easily check if your note is genuine using the following five security features.

2 SECURITY STRIP TEST

Tilt the note from left to right: red and green numbers move in opposite directions along four lines.

4 TRIANGLE TEST

Hold the triangle up to the light: the security thread forms a continuous line.





1 GLOBE TEST

Tilt the note from left to right: a golden arc moves across the globe.



Hold the Swiss cross up to the light: it will turn into the Swiss flag.

3 CROSS TEST





5 HAND TEST

Run your fingers over the hand, the number 50 or the bank's name: you will be able to feel the raised print.
